The **Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary** is a significant event in Christian tradition. It commemorates the visit of Mary, the Mother of God, to her cousin Elizabeth. According to the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:39-45), Mary, who was pregnant with Jesus, traveled to visit Elizabeth, who was also expecting a child—John the Baptist.

Mary's Journey: Mary hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea to visit Elizabeth. This journey symbolizes Mary's willingness to serve and her role as the bearer of Christ.

Elizabeth's Joy: When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby in her womb (John the Baptist) leaped for joy, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. Elizabeth recognized Mary's unique role and exclaimed, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear!" (Luke 1:41-42).

Mary's Magnificat: In response to Elizabeth's proclamation, Mary sang the beautiful hymn known as the **Magnificat** (Luke 1:46-55). This hymn praises God's faithfulness and mercy and reflects Mary's humility and trust.



The Feast of the Visitation is celebrated on May 31st each year. It reminds us of the joyous encounter between these two expectant mothers and their unborn children. Mary's visit to Elizabeth highlights the interconnectedness of God's plan and the role of both women in salvation history.
